- The upward trend in weighted averages at the weekly Treasury bill auction continued for a third consecutive week with the total accepted amount falling short of the total offered amount for a 12th consecutive week. (1)
- The rupee rate on the active one week forward contract was seen depreciating further yesterday to close the day at Rs. 150.70/80 against its previous day's closing levels of Rs. 150.25/45 on the back of continued importer demand. (2)
- The Sri Lankan government is to borrow more money from the Exim Bank of China to fund consultancy work on the extension of its southern expressway also funded by China. (3)

- Bank of Ceylon's Rs. 8 billion debenture issue was snapped up on its official opening day with high demand. The bank issued 50 million rated, unsecured, subordinated, redeemable debentures at an issue price of Rs. 100 each with an option to issue up to a further 30 million debentures in the event of an oversubscription of the initial issue. - Sri Lanka's first-ever utility-scale solar power plant was officially declared open in Baruthankanda, Hambantota yesterday. The privately owned plant is expected to add 10MW to the national grid . (5)
- China plans to build a liquid natural gas fired power plant an oil refinery and a dockyard involving 4.0 billion US dollars at Hambantota Port . (6)


